




At the age of 14, the Hong Kong-born Emma Yang has already created her own mobile app for Alzheimer's(老年痴呆) patients, which has impressed the likes of Bill Gates. Yang named it Timeless. The AI technology has been used to help Alzheimer's patients know the people in photos and remember who they are.

The inspiration(灵感) to develop an app that would help Alzheimer's patients connect with their loved ones came to Yang at the age of 12, when her grandmother suffered from the illness. Then, she decided to try her best to create the app.

“I wanted to create something to help people like my grandmother stay connected with their family,” Yang said. “I started learning coding(编码) when I was around 6, and later began developing games and websites,” Yang said. Yang's father, who works in the technology industry, was the one who introduced her to computers and Scratch, a programming program aimed at kids.

Still, Yang's life as a young software developer has not been without difficulties. Many businessmen have not taken her work seriously. Unstopped by such problems, Yang started an Indiegogo crowdfunding campaign(众筹) in March last year to support her Timeless app project.

“I think perseverance(坚持不懈) is really important,” Yang said. “Never let anyone tell you that you shouldn't be in the field that you want to be in the most.”

She encouraged other young people to believe in themselves, because the teenagers of today will be tomorrow's leaders.

Do you have a special talent or skill but can't find a crowd that enjoy it? If so, you might want to go to Christchurch, New Zealand, for the World Buskers Festival.

January is the summertime in New Zealand, and the entertainment (娱乐活动) takes place outside. However, this is not the typical outdoor music concert or festival you have known. The buskers—people who perform in the streets and in other public places—bring the city to life with amazing entertainment.

The event begins in late January and attracts around 300,000 visitors every year with about 500 performances. The performances include the circus (马戏表演) and magic acts, street dancing and singing, and other crazy forms of entertainment.

One of the best things about the festival is how well it attracts the whole family, from the youngest to the oldest. Laughs are everywhere, especially when unprepared visitors are asked to become a part of the performances.

The festival director says, "We have performers from all over the world. Most of the performances are free, so it means you can bring your family and spend a whole day here."

There's something for everyone at the World Buskers Festival, one of the biggest and most popular street festivals in the world.

**D**

According to a new study, people who have owned pets may be more successful in jobs, and this is good news for pet owners.

The researchers studied 857 persons in the United States with all kinds of jobs. Among the C-suite executives (CEOs, etc.) studied, 93 percent grew with a pet in their home, with 78 percent saying that growing up with a pet helped them to succeed in jobs when they were adults. Interestingly, 83 percent of CEOs said they grew up with a dog, 59 percent of them said they grew up with a cat, and 37 percent of them said they grew up with another kind of pet. It would seem that many of the people interviewed grew up with many kinds of pets.

CEOs said that their pets helped teach them lessons like duty, creativity, understanding, and organization, which have all been valuable in the business world.

But what about people who grew up without a pet, but have raised pets as adults? Luckily for those, the study showed that this could also help with success in jobs. According to the study, 86 percent of current (现在的) pet parents said owning pets helped them stick to a rule, better manage their time, and do many tasks more efficiently. In fact, 80 percent of people in the study said they "feel more connected to workmates who are pet owners," and 79 percent of those believed that co-workers who had pets were "hard workers".

What did the arrival of the Internet and 24-hour news mean for British newspapers?

This seemed to challenge the print newspapers greatly. They were worried that they would lose all their readers because of free online news, so many of them decided to create free online versions(版本) of their papers. But this brought about another problem: how does one make money when your product is free?

But in fact, there was no need for newspapers to worry. ①The Internet now provides newspapers with a different place to publish, as well as new media choices. Pod-casts and online videos are two examples.

This may explain why the readership of online newspapers in the UK is very different from the readership of print newspapers.

The most popular print newspaper in the UK is *The Sun*. It has a daily circulation (发行量) of nearly two million. The “mid-market (中端市场)” audience mainly reads *The Daily Mail*, which sells nearly 1.7 million copies daily. Of the “quality” newspapers, the most popular is *The Daily Telegraph*, which sells nearly half a million copies daily, followed by *The Times* and *The Guardian*.

Online, it's a different story. The most popular newspaper online is *The Mail*, which has 1.8 million visitors every day. And the next most popular is *The Guardian*, with 1.4 million browsers(浏览者) daily. ②实际上,许多在线读者不是来自于英国。*The Mail* and *The Guardian* are the two most-read newspapers in the USA, with *The New York Times* in third place.

No, the newspaper is not dead, just changing form and now reaching more people than ever.
